COURSE OUTLINE - INTRODUCTION TO HANGUL

Prior Knowledge and Skills

This course is for learners with no knowledge or minimal knowledge of the Korean Alphabet.

Proficiency Level

This course is a preparation course for Level 1 Korean.

Course Aim

At the end of the course learners should be able to recognise and read the basic Korean Hangul.

Course Details

No set textbook. Materials will be provided during the course.

- Tasks and resources will be provided in class.
- Recommendations regarding useful study apps and tips for memorising scripts will be provided by the teacher.

Revision

Language is learned best with maximum contact and usage. Home exercises will be designed for revision and consolidation of each course segment. Revision is most effective when undertaken regularly in short sessions.

Assessment

There will be no formal assessment for this course. Students will regularly monitor their own progress during each session.
