<b>Hotel Check-in</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Telling basic information for hotel check-in (name, booking number, room number etc)</li> <li>Finding out locations of hotel facilities</li> <li>Finding right place (female toilet, male bath etc)</li> <li>Useful greetings &amp; phrases (Excuse me, Thank you, you're welcome, good morning etc)</li> <li><i>Cultural focus:</i> Onsen (hot spring) etiquette</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Number 1-10</li> <li>Counter for floors (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, &amp; 3<sup>rd</sup> floor.)</li> <li>Expressions to check in at hotel (e.g. Check in please. I am John Smith. Your room is No.550)</li> <li>Expressions to ask for simple locations (e.g., Where is the restaurant? – <i>resutoran wa doko desu ka?</i> It's on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor. – <i>Ikkai desu.</i>)</li> <li>signs written in Kanji (male toilet, female bath, entrance, exit)</li> </ul>
<b>Catching a train</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Asking/ telling time</li> <li>Asking for basic information about transportation</li> <li>Buying train tickets</li> <li><i>Cultural focus:</i> Professional pushers at train stations</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Number 11-99</li> <li>Expressions related to transportation (e.g., Does this train goes to Kyoto? – <i>Kono densha wa Kyoto ni ikimasu ka.</i> What time is the next train? – <i>Tsugi no densha wa nanji desu ka?</i> Where is the Yamanote-line? – <i>Yamanote-sen wa doko desu ka?</i>)</li> <li>Counter for thin object such as ticket, paper etc)</li> <li>Expression to buy train tickets (e.g., Two tickets to Kyoto, please. – <i>Kyooto, ni-mai onegai shimasu.</i></li> </ul>
<b>Around town</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Requesting information about places (e.g., art gallery, train station, park etc)</li> <li><i>Cultural focus:</i> convenience stores &amp; vending machines</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Basic location (next to, in front of etc)</li> <li>Expressions for asking about places (e.g., Is there a convenience store? – <i>Konbini ga arimasu ka?</i> It's next to the bank. – <i>Ginkoo no tonari desu.</i>)</li> </ul>

<b>Shopping</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Asking if a store has what you want to buy</li> <li>• Asking for prices</li> <li>• Expressing quantities</li> <li>• Asking for a smaller / cheaper item</li> <li>• <i>Cultural focus:</i> wrapping &amp; packaging</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Numbers 100 - 90000</li> <li>• Expressions for shopping (e.g., Do you have Kimono? – <i>Kimono ga arimasu ka?</i> How much is it? – <i>Ikura desu ka?</i> Do you have a cheaper one? – <i>Moo chotto yasui no ga arimasu ka?</i></li> </ul>
<b>Take away or dining in?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ordering take-away food</li> <li>• Ordering food &amp; drinks at a restaurant/food outlet</li> <li>• <i>Cultural focus:</i> Ordering food with a ticket machine &amp; Do's &amp; don'ts in Japan</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Expressions for ordering (e.g., Coffee please. – <i>Koohii onegai shimasu.</i> Small size, please. – <i>S-saizu, onegai shimasu.</i>)</li> <li>• Saying no to plastic bag, chopsticks etc (e.g., No thanks to a bag, – <i>Baggu, kekkoo desu.</i>)</li> </ul>
